Indigenous and non-Indigenous citizens with an interest in community development, tradition, and wellness are invited to apply by Tuesday, September 20, 2019.

ONFC's vision is to ensure a thriving and resilient community. Odawa strives to enhance the quality of life of Indigenous People in the Capital region; to maintain a tradition of community, an ethic of self-help and development as well as to provide traditional teachings from our elders.

Working in partnership with the Executive Director, the role of the ONFC Board of Directors is guided by the goals of the ONFC's Strategic Plan. The Board is particularly interested in recruiting members that represent the strategic areas identified in the plan as well as reflecting our community's linguistic and cultural diversity.

ONFC's Board of Directors meets once a month, starting at 6:00 p.m., for approximately 2 to 2.5 hours. The Board also has a number of sub-committees that meet throughout the year. These appointments are for a two-year term. Service on the ONFC Board of Directors is an unpaid, volunteer position.
